








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State Statute and Policy Overview: Credit for Military Learning


ACML-Articulated Credit for Military Learning PLA-Prior Learning Assessment






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Current College Application Process Comparison







The BA in Leadership and Workforce Development

The BA in Leadership and Workforce Development (BA in LWD) is a 120 credit hour bachelor's degree program offered by the U.S. Army Command and General Staff College (CGSC) at the U.S. Army Sergeants Major Academy (USASMA) to noncommissioned officers attending the resident Sergeants Major Course (SMC).

- The BA in LWD is **both** a degree completion program for SMC students and a way for more junior noncommissioned officers to gain college credit for work experience and NCO Education System (NCOES) prior learning.
- Most importantly, the BA in LWD is a degree program that helps the Army develop better NCOs, ready to lead and inspire Soldiers and units.

"Leadership" and "workforce development" are core competencies and essential requirements for Army noncommissioned officers. The BA in LWD intentionally leverages the Army's leader development program for NCOs, as well as individuals' professional experience.
