Three key outcomes of sustainability







Serving adults = key state priority Priority embedded in policies, governance, institutional efforts Communication explicitly engages adults





Serving adults = key state priority

- Expanding the net impetus for broader range of partners, providers, credentials, and state-level actors
- Raising awareness clear understanding of your state's prospective adult learner population <u>shared</u> with key policymakers and stakeholders
- Building will advocacy efforts (including leaders, supporters, and those who simply "aren't against it")





Priority embedded in policies, governance, institutional efforts

- Policy in all its forms money, measures, barrier removal, incentives at state, system, institutional levels
- Sustained dialogue ongoing space for cross-stakeholder ownership of the priority, data, strategies
- Visibility adults show up in state and institutional strategic plans, regular meetings, reports, accountability systems



Policy efforts already underway in Adult Promise states

Removing aid eligibility requirements for adults to access existing state financial aid programs	Removing other barriers to adult students getting aid	Removing barriers for aid to go toward adult- friendly programs	Creating new grant/scholarship programs for adult learners
Earmarking state appropriations specifically for adult learners in state aid programs	Helping adult learners line up supports beyond direct education expenses	Making prospective adult learners aware of available financial aid	Statewide prior learning and CBE standards and incentives



Communication explicitly engages adults

- Messages tailored for what adults want and need to hear – financial resources, program → career pathways, connections to employers
- Core language goes to several target audiences – different types of adults, employers, institutions
- Rapid prototyping what worked? What didn't? Why?
- Messengers matter who has trust and legitimacy and with what audience?





High School Reform





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


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
Figure 2.2. Percentage of high school dropouts among persons 16 through 24 years old (status dropout rate): October 1970 through 2014





Trade Adjustment Assistance and Community College and Career Training (TAACCCT Grants)

2007-08: Great Recession hit hardest those with no postsecondary creds



2009: \$2B federal funding approved for TAACCT program



2010-14: DOL and USED awarded 256 grants that touched 700+ CCs (60%!)

Goals:

- 1. Build the capacity of community colleges to serve adults, many of whom had never gone to college or were returning after a long time out of school
- 2. Expand the evidence base around effective job training and re-employment approaches.



Figure 2. Meta-analysis of Education Outcomes





Figure 3. Meta-analysis of Employment Outcomes





Lumina's Attainment Challenge Grants

2009: Goal 2025 becomes focus of Lumina's grantmaking 2016-17: Lumina offers \$100K incentive grants for states to set quantifiable, challenging, equity-focused goals.

2018-19: States with goals increases from 26 to 39 states.


