Dear Senator Carper and Senator Moran:

We are writing to thank you for your commitment to student parents and to congratulate you on the passage of S.Res.777, National Student Parent Month, to designate September 2023 as "National Student Parent Month." The undersigned organizations are thrilled to join you in celebrating the recognitions and achievements of student parents across the country this month.

Parenting students continue to make up almost a <u>quarter</u> of the undergraduate student population — almost 4 million students. Additionally, 37% of Black women, 27% of American Indian/Alaska Native women, 19% of Hispanic women, and 7% of Asian/Pacific Islander women in college are <u>single parents</u>. Furthermore, <u>6 in 10</u> parenting students work over 30 hours per week combined with going to school, studying, and caring for their children.

Parenting students are uniquely motivated to succeed in higher education, despite facing many challenges. In fact, student parents tend to have higher grade point averages than their non-parenting peers. But, due to structural barriers and lack of support, they are <u>10 times</u> less likely than students without children to complete a bachelor's degree within five years. It is only by changing how the system serves this critical population that their likelihood of attaining a degree can increase.

Raising awareness about this population is critical to understanding their experiences and paving a smoother path for their postsecondary success. We are grateful for your commitment to supporting and celebrating student parents through the passage of the National Student Parent Month resolution and we look forward to continuing to work with you to support student parents.
