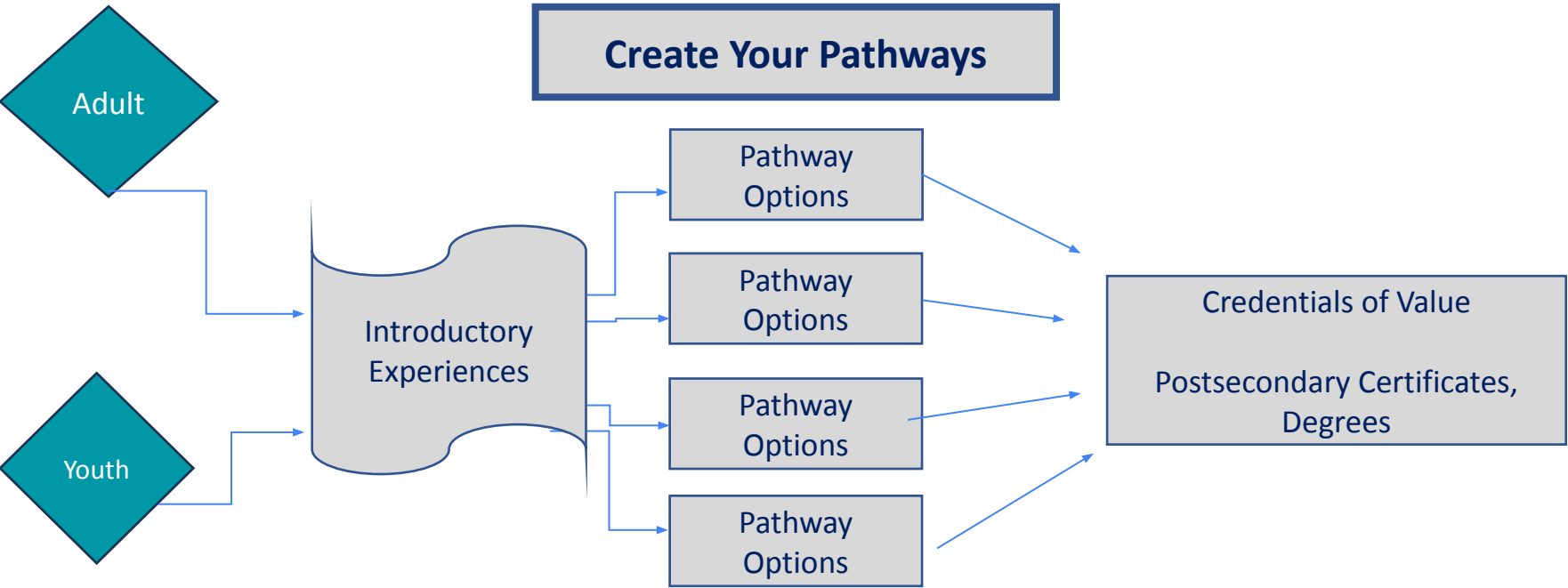
What Is The Rural Talent Lab?

- **Vision:** Transforming rural postsecondary opportunities and community vitality through statewide planning.
- **Timeline:** Four-year initiative (2025-2029)
- **Key Goal:** Develop 4+ sub-baccalaureate pathways (i.e. associate's, certificate, microcredential) in five states that will enroll learners in Fall 2027

Components:

- Community listening tours
- Public opinion surveys
- Demographic, economic, and labor-market data analysis
- In-person learning academies
- Expert advising and coaching support
- Technical assistance and travel funds

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What Will States Do?

What Will States Do?

- Create a Statewide Plan for Rural Talent Development and Attraction
- Implement at least four, middle-skill credential pathways tailored to specific rural needs
- Engage directly with rural communities and stakeholders

Participate In:

- Community listening tours
- Four, in-person Academies (e.g., October 2025 at Appalachian State)
- Host site visits for non-selected states
- Support project evaluation activities
- Ongoing surveys to assess state teams' learning, as well as evolving state needs

What Will States Do? State Participation Activities

- **Participate in community listening tours**
 - 4-5 stops across the state
 - Focus groups (designed by the research team) with a range of community stakeholders
 - Listening tour dates will be finalized in October 2025
- **Attend four in-person Academies**
 - 2 days, 3 nights per Academy
 - First Academy: October 28-29, 2025 at Appalachian State University
 - Remaining Academy dates and locations (in selected states) will be finalized by the first Academy
- **Hosting site visits for non-selected states**
 - 1-2 days for conversations to help non-selected states determine their readiness for a future cohort
 - Travel for visiting states will be covered by the Rural Talent Lab
- **Support program evaluation activities**
 - Periodic surveys of selected state teams
 - Pathway Participant Survey

What Will States Do? Support for Selected States

- Up to \$100,000 technical assistance funding
 - Administered by ARRC through a pre-approval/reimbursement process
- \$25,000 travel support
 - Lump-sum payment to cover travel to Academies, etc.
 - Listening tour costs will be covered separate from this amount
- Dedicated and intensive advising
- Robust data collection and analysis
- Program evaluation
- National visibility opportunities

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What Makes This Project Unique?

What Makes This Project Unique?

- Community-first model emphasizing rural assets
- Values rural lived experience and expertise
- Rejects deficit narratives about rural people and places
- Affirms rural self-determination
- Not focused on campus mergers, consolidations, or closures
 - Emphasizes right-sizing, capacity-building, and sustainability
- Intentional knowledge dissemination
- Learning exchange with non-participant states
 - Encourage other states to undertake this work in the future

- Statewide planning teams
- Organizations with associate degree, undergraduate certificate, and/or microcredential programs
- Entities with the capacity to collaborate across:
 - Postsecondary and K-12 education sectors
 - Workforce development
 - Economic development
