


UW, other Washington colleges face big financial challenges


Across the state, Washington's struggling public colleges and universities are laying off staff, raising tuition, cutting administrators and trimming programs.

State budget cuts have landed at a time when severe cutbacks by President Donald Trump's administration, on top of inflation, are exerting financial stress on the schools. The administration's decision to broadly cut billions in feder-

al research dollars will be a major revenue hit to the University of Washington. The cost of providing health care and other benefits to staff is rising. And international students - who help subsidize in-state students by paying higher tuition - are turning to Europe, Canada and other countries, although a full tally of international enrollment won't be available until the fall.

With all of those challenges, "it would have been opportune to ask the state to step in" with extra money, said Ruben Flores, executive

- Enrollment will decline
- Public support for higher education will falter
- Persistence and completion gains will stall
- University research will become financially unsustainable
- State budget cuts will be widespread
- Investigations and political control will increase
- Employers will be exasperated and will outsource further
- The economy will contract

The Path Forward – **State** Roles

- Don't wait: describe where new funding is needed
- Detailed economic modeling
- Utilize data systems to describe student populations
- Attract new people to higher ed with simple financial aid programs
- Meet students' basic needs
- Remove eligibility barriers that reduce confidence in government

The Path Forward – **Institution** Roles

- Lean into real advocacy nationally and in states
- Oppose legal attacks with everything we have
- Resist short-term budget decisions that subvert public mission
- Be the legal defenders of our students
- Open new doors by expanding slots
- Help students access education even if they have basic needs barriers
- Encourage more civic engagement and voting
