

# What does the GAINS Act do?



- **Every fall and spring quarter/semester:** Update student parent websites for on- and off-campus resources
- **By July 31, 2025:** Develop and disseminate a cost of attendance (COA) adjustment policy for student parents
- **By the start of the 2026-27 academic year:**
  - Implement COA adjustment policy
  - Update the campus net price calculator to include a baseline student parent cost estimate
  - Establish a data field in campuses' data management system to identify parenting students
  - Collect student parent data using that field
  - Report student parent data to segment Chancellor's or President's Office for inclusion in the Cradle to Career Data System





<b>Purpose:</b>	<p>This document compiles key campus web pages and several of the resources campuses need to cover—and update—to adhere to the GAINS Act and other related legislation, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Student parent web pages;</li> <li>• Financial aid web pages;</li> <li>• Cost of attendance and cost of attendance adjustment web pages;</li> <li>• Dependent care allowance web pages; and</li> <li>• Basic Needs Center web pages.</li> </ul> <p>We intend for this resource to serve as a helpful reference for student parents and the faculty and staff who serve them, both to find crucial information and to easily comply with the GAINS Act.</p>

<b>RE:</b>	Implementation of AB686 Student Impact Cost of Attendance Adjustments and Resources	

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This memorandum aims to outline requirements of **Assembly Bill 686** (Assembly Bill 686), which requires each California community college and district to implement a policy for estimating and adjusting cost of attendance (COA) information for student parents on or before the start of the 2025-26 academic year. In accordance with AB 686, this memorandum establishes the recommended methodology and practices for COA adjustments.

Furthermore, this memorandum provides instructions for:

- Identifying enrolled student parents and local data collection.
- Including cost of attendance information in admitted student materials.
- Informing the dependent care allowance to student parents; and
- Informing student parents of affordable childcare options offered by the campus or within the local community.

Guidelines and instructions in this memorandum are in alignment with the federal Higher Education Act (HEA) Title IV, under which California community colleges are permitted to adjust non-federal costs of attendance for student parents.<sup>1</sup> Information regarding local requirements for financial aid information, costs of attendance policies, and dependent care costs allowance are available in the **Federal Student Aid Handbook**.



Figure 2: Undergraduate Food and Housing Insecurity by Population, 2022\*



# UCOP AB 2881 Guidance/Toolkit and Community of Practice



- **Priority Registration:**
  - Law requires, at minimum, to use financial aid to identify parenting students
  - **Recommendation:** Use a more inclusive definition not dependent on 50% or more financial support. Use financial aid + other means to identify parenting students. Provide multiple opportunities for students to self-identify
    - Example: CADAA, admissions application (beg. Fall 2021), campus programs (childcare, parenting support, etc.), caregiver affidavits, priority registration data, etc.
- **Resource Information for Website, Orientations and Student Accounts**
  - **Recommendation:** Work with campus basic needs and parenting programs to identify resources and assist students. Direct links for outreach materials and toolkits provided in guidance.
  - Refer students to free tax assistance, such as Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA)




# Cost of Attendance at UC



- Survey every 2 years
- 3 budgets for each campus (commuter, on-campus, and off-campus)
- Combination of survey and administrative data

27 Standard Methodology Student Cost of Attendance




# Education Financing Model: Financial Aid Goal



- For students in similar circumstances, equal net cost
- Funding partnership:
  - Federal, state, UC aid
  - Families through part-time work, loan

# Steps in Policy Changes for Parenting Student Financial Aid



## Trend in Cost of Attendance and Aid

- Increasingly, financial aid has recognized that more dimensions than housing choice and income affect affordability
- Other examples: Foster youth

## State Signal on Parenting Students

- State enhanced its Cal Grant program with an additional \$6,000 for parenting students in 2020
- UC duplicated this for low-income students without a Cal Grant
- GAINS Act


## Trade-Offs in Raising Cost of Attendance

- Augmenting cost of attendance without additional grants means more loan eligibility
- Campus flexibility on how much of additional costs are covered by grant versus loan

# UC Sample Student Packages: Changes in Cost of Attendance, Aid Offers



- Additional parent grant (Cal Grant or UC Grant) offsets original self-help
- Augmented costs for parenting students:
  - Some met with grant
  - Some met with loan
