




National Rural Higher Education Research Center

Center Overview

- Five-year project funded by Institute of Education Sciences
- Mission: Assess strategies for improving rates of postsecondary enrollment and completion for students from rural communities across the United States
- Approach: Work closely with state agencies to answer local/regional questions about rural postsecondary education and workforce development



The Center has four research questions:



What is the current rural college-going and college completion landscape nationally, and how does it vary across regions and student demographics?



How can academic pathways between high school and college be strengthened for rural high school students?




How do prospective college students in rural areas conceptualize their postsecondary options and make decisions about undertaking college or workforce training?








Four States, Four Geographies

Tennessee Landscape




Dual Enrollment





Oregon Postsecondary Education




Decentralized governance – local governing boards + a coordinating commission that includes workforce. 25 public institutions, 9 workforce boards.

Rural/frontier areas – 80% of Oregonians live along IH-5. State population is 65% urban, 33% rural, and 2% frontier.

Achievement gaps – 65% of HS are rural enrolling 42% of students; 30% are students of color with 75% free/reduced lunch eligible; gaps in enrollment, persistence, and completion.

- 16 institutions (R1s, special designation S&T, regional comprehensives, embedded and stand alone 2-years)
- ~42,000 students
- Board of Regents has sole constitutional authority to govern as one institution
- 96% of K-12 districts are rural designated
- 4th largest geography
- 61% of all businesses are small
