St. Mary's Food Bank

In 1967, **John van Hengel founded St. Mary's Food Bank in Phoenix** after meeting a struggling mother who inspired his vision of a "food bank" where surplus food could help those in need. With support from St. Mary's Basilica, he launched what became **the model for food banks worldwide**. Van Hengel went on to establish the national food bank network now called Feeding America, and the Global Food Banking Network, earning him the title "father of food banking." Today, St. Mary's stands among **the largest and most respected** food banks in the world, recognized by Forbes and Charity Navigator for its impact and stewardship.








